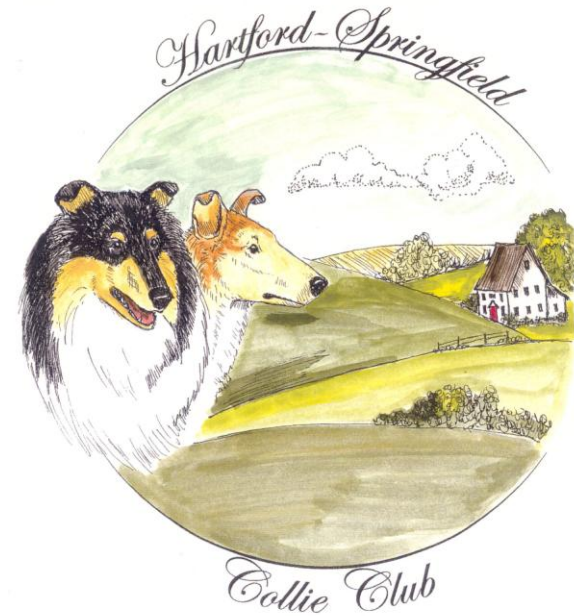

AKC Code of Sportsmanship

PREFACE: The sport of purebred dog competitive events dates prior to 1884, the year of AKC's birth. Shared values of those involved in the sport include principles of sportsmanship. They are practiced in all sectors of our sport: conformation, performance and companion. Many believe that these principles of sportsmanship are the prime reason why our sport has thrived for over one hundred years. With the belief that it is useful to periodically articulate the fundamentals of our sport, this code is presented.

- Sportsmen respect the history, traditions and integrity of the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen commit themselves to values of fair play, honesty, courtesy, and vigorous competition, as well as winning and losing with grace.
- Sportsmen refuse to compromise their commitment and obligation to the sport of purebred dogs by injecting personal advantage or consideration into their decisions or behavior.
- The sportsman judge judges only on the merits of the dogs and considers no other factors.
- The sportsman judge or exhibitor accepts constructive criticism.
- The sportsman exhibitor declines to enter or exhibit under a judge where it might reasonably appear that the judge's placements could be based on something other than the merits of the dogs.
- The sportsman exhibitor refuses to compromise the impartiality of a judge.
- The sportsman respects the AKC bylaws, rules, regulations and policies governing the sport of purebred dogs.
- Sportsmen find that vigorous competition and civility are not inconsistent and are able to appreciate the merit of their competition and the effort of competitors.
- Sportsmen welcome, encourage and support newcomers to the sport.
- Sportsmen will deal fairly with all those who trade with them.
- Sportsmen are willing to share honest and open appraisals of both the strengths and weaknesses of their breeding stock.
- Sportsmen spurn any opportunity to take personal advantage of positions offered or bestowed upon them.
- Sportsmen always consider as paramount the welfare of their dog.
- Sportsmen refuse to embarrass the sport, the American Kennel Club, or themselves while taking part in the sport.

PROCEDURES FOR DEALING WITH SICKNESS AT EVENT ▪ Exhibitors are required to self-assess daily. ▪ If anyone exhibits symptoms of acute respiratory illness consistent with COVID-19 – such as fever, cough, chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat or shortness of breath - that is not explained by another medical or allergic condition please send a text message to Mary Lange 860-331-0413 Stay in your vehicle the moment you have the symptom. They will provide addition instructions based on you answer some questions. ▪ The potentially infected person will be referred to a COVID testing site, Sent Home, or Sent to the Hospital based on the situation. A decision will be made by the exhibitor if they wish to have their dogs shown by volunteer handlers or if they wish to depart. In the event of this situation occurring, exhibitors will be notified and told of the actions taken to protect everyone else at the shows.

GENERAL PRACTICES ▪ Clubs, officials & participants are required to follow CDC & CT Dept of Health Guidelines at all times. ▪ Everyone should wash their hands as frequently as possible for at least 20 seconds. ▪ Avoid shaking hands, hugging, or other physical contact. ▪ Avoid touching dogs that are not your responsibility. ▪ Avoid common use pens/pencils –bring your own writing instruments. ▪ Exhibitors must provide their own means for cleaning up from their dogs & the entire facility. . ▪ Prepare to be self-sufficient: bring sanitizer, bring personal use masks. There will be hand sanitizing stations and we will have extra masks in case someone needs one.

You will get your Arm Bands for the both events when you hand in your waiver and get your badge which acts as your entrance pass for the event.
▪ Everyone must sign and hand in a waiver. This includes Exhibitors, Handlers, Judges, Club Members, Assistants, No waiver = No access
▪ Do not congregate at the ring or ring gate. ▪ While showing your dog, maintain social distances with other exhibitors. ▪ When seated at the ring you must maintain social distancing of 6'. MASKS ARE REQUIRED OVER YOUR NOSE AND MOUTH AT ALL TIMES! SOCIAL DISTANCING IS REQUIRED.

Welcome to the HSCC Herding Trial Event. We want to provide you with a fun, enjoyable and memorable event here in Connecticut. That starts with your Access Badge which you will receive when you turn in your signed waiver. Armbands will not be handed out without a waiver. Temperature checks will be taken at the entrance of the property. Anyone with an abnormal temperature will be turned away. The most important thing is to provide everyone involved in the shows a safe environment and to do everything possible to STOP THE SPREAD! This include wearing masks, social distancing, using the hand sanitizing stations. PLEASE review all the rules listed below for this event. If you cannot or will not follow the below rules at all times please do not come. We will not put people’s lives at risk by having people think the rules don’t apply to them. COVID-19 RULES for CONNECTICUT. Anyone attending this event must either be an owner, exhibitor, handler, judge, club members, stewards.. Any family members or friends attending the event must enter with an owner or handler of the dog (first time entering) and get an access pass. General public will not be allowed on the grounds (to the best we can control) and if found trial site will be politely and professionally escorted off the premises.

1. Masks are REQUIRED and MUST cover your mouth AND nose at all times unless stated below. When inside any building under CT Guidelines – Masks are required at ALL times. You may raise or lower your mask to get a drink or wipe sweat away but must maintain social distancing. You may keep your mask on or off when with your dog in the ring, but must maintain social distancing.

Outdoors – Under NEW CT guidelines mask are required 100% of the time when in public areas. Under the new guideline mask must be worn at all times while at the event REGARDLESS if you can or cannot social distance. Masks do not need to be worn in your Vehicle space area as long as you are able to social distance (6’). You do not need to wear masks if the people round you are staying with you. Judges will have hand sanitizer and hand sanitizer will be available to all exhibitors throughout the show.

ARMBAND, WAIVER & ACCESS PASS. Access passes and armbands will only be given out after a temperature check and receipt of signed waiver. Please respect all club members and social distance and do not take off your mask. No public chairs will be provided. Please bring your own chair and remove it when you are finished watching. THERE WILL BE A ZERO TOLLERANCE POLICY ON COVID-19 VIOLATIONS, INCLUDING NOT WEARING A MASK OR NOT SOCIAL DISTANCING WHEN IT IS POSSIBLE. DEPENDING ON THE LEVEL OF THE VIOLOATION YOU MAY GET A FRIENDLY REMINDER OR YOU MAY BE ASKED TO PACK YOU STUFF AND LEAVE IMMEDIATELY. IF YOU ARE ASKED TO LEAVE, THERE WILL BE A BENCH SHOW HEARING HELD AT A LATER DATE VIA TELECONFERCE AS ALLOWED IN AKC DEALING WITH MISCONDUCT.

Agreement

I (We) acknowledge that the "Rules Applying to Dog Shows/Registration and Discipline," and the "Rules for Herding Test or Trials", have been made available to me (us), and that I am (we are) familiar with their contents. I (we) agree to hold the AKC and any AKC approved judge harmless from any legal claim resulting from said AKC judge's action under the "AKC Rules, Regulations and Guidelines."

I (we) agree that the club holding this event has the right to refuse this entry for cause which the club shall deem sufficient. In consideration of the acceptance of this entry and of the holding of this event and of the opportunity to have the dog judged and to win prize money, ribbons, or trophies, I (we) agree to hold the AKC, the event giving club, their members, directors, governors, officers, agents superintendents or event secretary and the owner or lesser of the premises and any provider of services that are necessary to hold this event and any employees or volunteers of the aforementioned parties, and any AKC approved judge, judging at this event, harmless from any claim for loss or injury which may be alleged to have been caused directly or indirectly to any person or thing by the act of this dog while in or about the event premises or grounds or near any entrance thereto, and I (we) personally assume all responsibility and liability for any such claim; and I (we) further agree to hold the aforementioned parties harmless from any claim for loss, injury or damage to this dog. I (we) will pay for any injuries or the replacement value in the event of serious injury to the livestock caused by my (our) dog. I (we) agree that the determination of whether the injury is serious shall be made by the event veterinarian and is binding on me (us).

Additionally, I (we) hereby assume the sole responsibility for and agree to indemnify, defend and save the aforementioned parties harmless from any and all loss and expense (including legal fees) by reason of the liability imposed by law upon any of the aforementioned parties for damage because of bodily injuries, including death at any time resulting there from, sustained by any person or persons, including myself (ourselves) or on account of damage to property, arising out of or in consequence of my (our) participation in this event, however such, injuries death or property damage may be caused, and whether or not the same may have been caused or may be alleged to have been caused by the negligence of the aforementioned parties or any of their employees, agents, or any other persons. From Rte 395: Take Exit 81W or 82 (2 West/32 North). Follow signs to Rte 32 North to the junction of Rte 87. Turn left on Rte 87 (Getty Mart on corner) through center of Lebanon (7 miles). Bear left at the second stop sign (still Rte 87) then 1 mile to the second stop sign (still Rte 87) then 1 mile to the second left onto Oliver Rd to the first driveway on the left (black mailbox #33).

From Rte 2 East: Take Exit 13 to Route 66 East through Columbia Center (approx. 10 miles). Turn right onto Rte 87 South. Go 4.6 miles (0.3 miles after "Log Cabin"). Turn right onto Oliver Rd. to the first driveway on left (black mailbox #33).

Entries will not be accepted without fees. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry. The Secretary will add a collection fee to the amount of each returned check. Canadian exhibitors must submit entries with an international money order guaranteed in U.S. funds.

If sending entries overnight, make sure to sign the waiver that allows them to leave packages without a signature, Requiring a signature will only delay receipt of your entries.

A separate entry form must be submitted for each entry. Entries not on official AKC entry forms or photocopies without the agreement and rules are unacceptable. Telephone, telegraph, fax and unsigned entries cannot be accepted. Changes additions or corrections to entry forms must be received in writing prior to the close of entries. No refund for duplicate entries or any other cause beyond the control of the club after the closing date.

The club may decline entries for cause and may refuse to receive or remove any dog on account of disease, viciousness, or other cause and no one shall have any claim or recourse against the club or any official thereof.

PLEASE NOTE: Exhibitors should follow their veterinarians' recommendation to assure their dogs are free of internal and external parasites, any communicable disease and have appropriate vaccinations.

TRIAL REGULATIONS

Proof of current rabies vaccinations must be furnished upon request.

All dogs must be held on leash, except during trial. Dogs must be kept a suitable distance away from the trial area. Handlers should bring water and shade and pick up after their dogs.

This Show will be open from 8 AM to 5 PM. CONSULT JUDGING PROGRAM for time of judging.

JUDGES ARE NOT REQUIRED TO WAIT for dogs. They will adhere as closely as possible to the judging schedule. The owner or handler of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when its class is to be judged.

DOGS NOT REQUIRED for further judging will be excused.

ENTRY FEE shall not be refunded in the event that the dog is absent, excused by the judge or veterinarian, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee

Errors on entry forms: Owners are responsible for errors in making out entry forms (whoever may make such errors) and no entry fee will be refunded in event of such errors or cancellation of entries after the published closing date. Please type or print clearly and carefully the information on entry forms to eliminate errors.
